#### The Schools' Energy Co-op AGM 17.09.2019 at 19.00

#### Guildford United Reformed Church

# Portsmouth Road, Guildford

Present: Directors of the Board: Mike Smyth- Chair- (MS), Rod Edge (RD), Richard Watson (RW), Eilish Kavanagh (EK), Andy Rolfe (AR) and Laura Moreno (LM). Apologies from Alan Simpson

6 further members and 1 guest were present.

#### 1. Introductions:

MS welcomed the members and introduced the board. He gave a special mention to Richard Watson as he was launching the next day Energise South Community Energy, a new E4A co-op member in Hastings.

#### 2. Energy4All

MS started the AGM with a presentation about E4A and its work during the previous year, and its current projects.

#### 3. Operations

MS reported that the 4<sup>th</sup> Share Offer had raised £950,000 and was now nearly fully invested; that the generation of electricity from our systems have gone well in 2018/9 and subsequently and we are broadly on target. The main outstanding issue was installing the export meters and we are losing some income due to this. Rachael Hunter is working hard to get this resolved.

MS explained that we have done our first LED project at Nigel Bowes School but it is difficult to get a workable financial model. Repairs posed an issue and the payback was too long. It was difficult to balance risk and reward, although the project was very worthwhile in terms of energy efficiency.

MS is concerned that we are not meeting our expectations in terms of communications and relations with our school members. He explained this is due to our work been focused on delivery of new installations.

# 4. London Schools

AR took over to present the work Transition Ealing and SEC have achieved in Ealing and Harrow and the Greater London Authority grant.

# 5. New Installations

LM made a presentation about the new installations and the pipe line for the next coming months.

### 6. Accounts

RE presented the accounts. MS thanked Rod for all his hard work as he was now retiring as a director. He had been one of the Co-op's founders and had been actively engaged in the Co-op since its

formation and in advising it on its initial steps. Eilish Kavanagh, an accountant and a member of the Co-op, was proposed to take over in his place.

#### 7. Interest, dividends to schools and redemption of shares

The Board proposed an interest rate of 5% interest on the first three share offers. The 4th share issue was not entitled to interest for the year. The co-op had the intention to increase the interest by inflation on the shares issued under the first three offers (the 4th share issue was at a fixed rate) and increase the school dividend in the future, but that it was not prudent to do so yet.

We would share £6,000 with the school members this year.
